NOTE ON A COLLECTION OF SPIDERS FROM PERIYAR TIGER RESERVE, KERALA, S. INDIA

Introduction

The richness and diversity of life forms in Kerala particularly Periyar Tiger Reserve is well known. Various animal groups in the area have been completely or incompletely documented. But Spiders, in spite of their importance in the ecosystem have been almost completely neglected in Kerala, as elsewhere in India. The reason for this could be attributed to the unattractive or scaring nature of the group. There are only very few references on the group in India: the latest being that of Pocock (1900), Tikader (1980, 1982, 1987) Vijayalakshmi and Ahimaz (1993). The documentation of Spider fauna of India as per these references seem to be incomplete and does not represent a portion of the Kerala's rain forest fauna.

Periyar Tiger Reserve, situated on the Western Ghats in the Idukky District of Kerala seem to harbour a rich spider fauna as per preliminary observations. Spiders were collected from the Thekkady area of the reserve in April 1997 with a view to initiating an inventory of this little known group. The specimens are collected with forceps preserved in 5% formaldehyde and brought to the laboratory of the Rajiv Gandhi Centre for identification. But due to the non-availability of sufficient literature only few of the collected specimens could be properly identified.

The following is a list of 20 species of Spiders collected from Periyar in April 1997. The aim of this note is to highlight the importance of Spiders in this area and other parts of Kerala. The list though small, could be a start on the study of this little known animal group in Periyar and Kerala as a whole.

Moist deciduous forests-small shrubs India (Trichur, Parambikulam, Cochin, Orissa, U.P.), Sri Lanka, Burma

8. L. tessellata

Moist deciduous forests-small shrubs India including Kerala (Cochin), Burma

9. L. ventralis

Moist deciduous forests - Small shrubs S. India (Chalakudy, Parambikulam, Cochin), West Bengal, Sri Lanka, Burma

10. L. celebesiana

Moist deciduous forests, small shrubs India including Tamil Nadu (no record from Kerala), Sri Lanka, Burma, China

11. Ordagarius hobsoni

Moist deciduous forests - small shrubs India (Maharashtra), Sri Lanka

12. Nephila maculata

Semi-evergreen forests - trees and shrubs. India (Trivandrum, Tirunelveli, Kanara, Dehra Dun, Darjeeling), Sri Lanka, China, S.E. Asia. Family: Hersilidae

13. Hersilia pectinata

Tree trunks and walls of building Sri Lanka, Burma

Family: Heteropodidae

14. Heteropoda venatoria Giant Crab

Buildings-in cracks and among stored materials

Cosmopolitan - Tropical and Temperate countries

Family: Pholcidae

15. Pholcus phalangoides Daddy longlegSpidersBuildings - in cracks

Cosmopolitan

16. Crosopriza lyoni Box long legs
Hollows of trees, under rocks, corners
of houses

17. Artema atlanta

Moist deciduous forests - shrubs and grasses

 Moist deciduous forests - shrubs, grasses
 India (Madras, Pondicherry, Travancore), Sri Lanka

In a preliminary survey, 20 species of Spiders were identified in Periyar Tiger Reserve. It seems that the reserve has much potential for a detailed Arachnid survey.
